HUNT MILITARY COMMUNITIES CELEBRATES THE MONTH OF THE MILITARY CHILD

April is nationally recognized as the "Month of the Military Child," a month dedicated to celebrating the children of military service members. Now in its 28th year, Month of the Military Child is a time to acknowledge and applaud the children of our military community for their daily sacrifices and resilience in the face of adversity. Every day, millions of military children prove their courage and strength while dealing with separation from family, frequent moves, and the fear associated with having a deployed parent.

The color purple displays support for military children and represents all the military branches, combining Air Force blue, Army green, Coast Guard blue, Marine red, and Navy blue. Throughout April, families living in a Hunt community should be on the lookout for purple balloons scattered around the neighborhood. Those who spot a balloon are asked to snap a photo and tag Hunt Military Communities on Facebook and Instagram with the hashtag #HMCPurpleUp.

At Hunt Military Communities, we understand the sacrifices and challenges that military children face daily. In honor of the Month of the Military Child, we've launched our fifth annual "Hunt Little Heroes" program. The initiative is an opportunity for us at HMC to recognize and celebrate military children across the nation who are heroes within their communities. We are asking military children to share their "Hero Story" with us, detailing what they think it takes to be a hero and how they make a difference in their communities. Submissions can be in the form of a 300-word essay or a short video.

The Hunt Little Heroes program is open to all military children between the ages of 4-16 years old, regardless if they live in a Hunt community. All applicants will receive a special hero cape, mask, coin, and a letter of appreciation for sharing their hero story. Winners will be selected and recognized in their community with a special "coining" ceremony and a monetary prize of \$1,000 to the first place "Little Hero," \$500 for second place, and \$300 to the third-place winner. Each winner will choose a charity to receive an equal monetary gift.

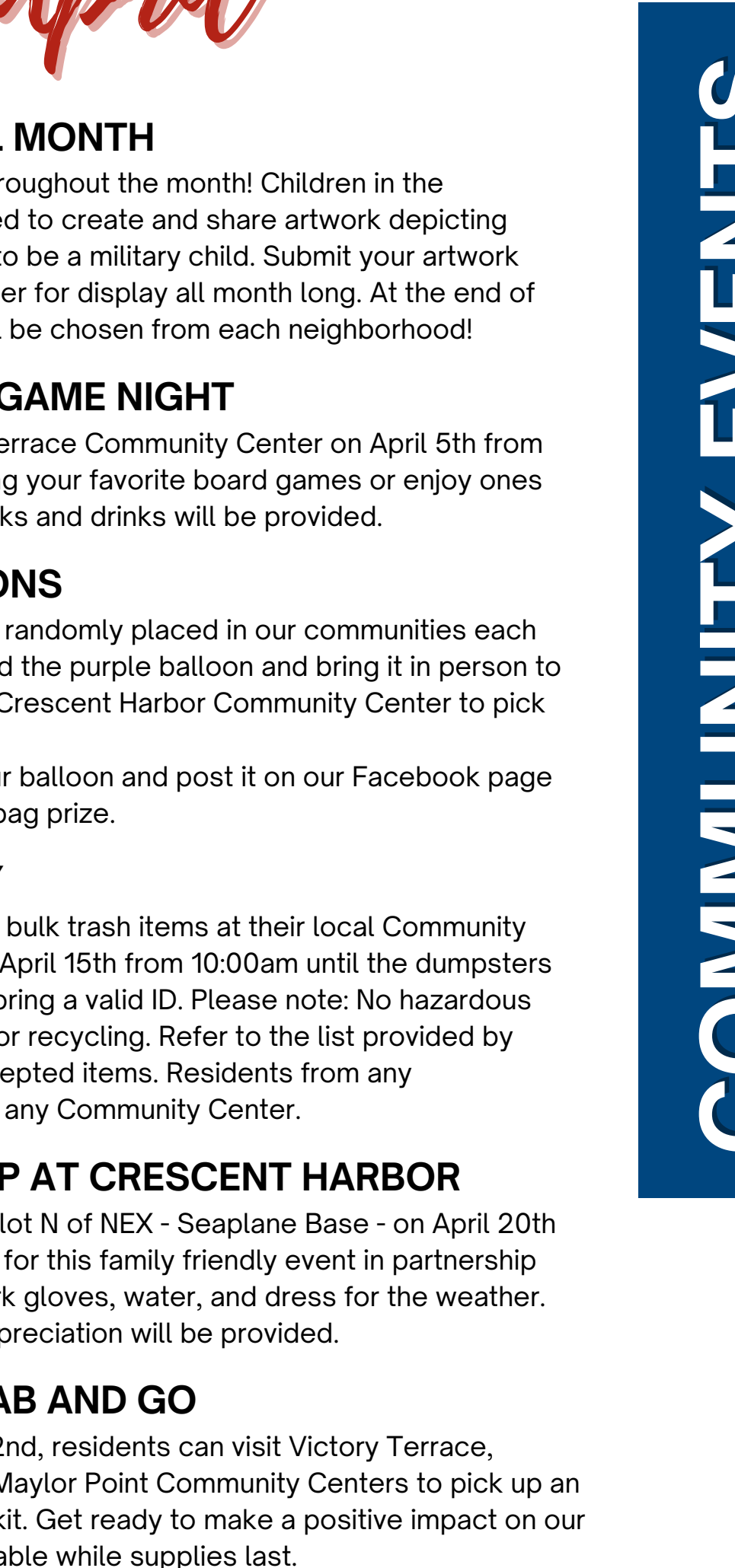
DETECTORS

DUMPSTER DAY

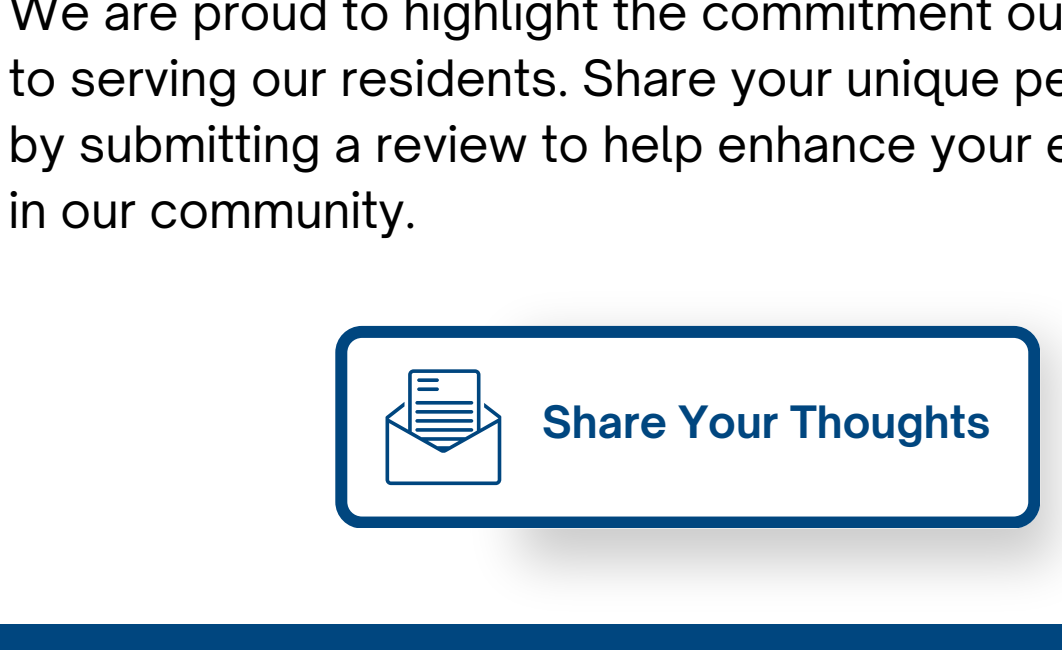

EARTH DAY GRAB AND GO

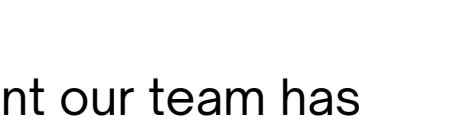

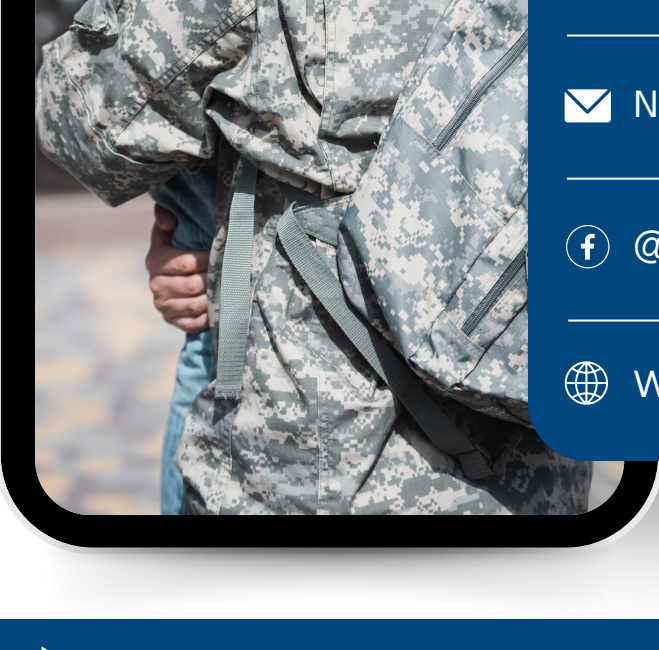

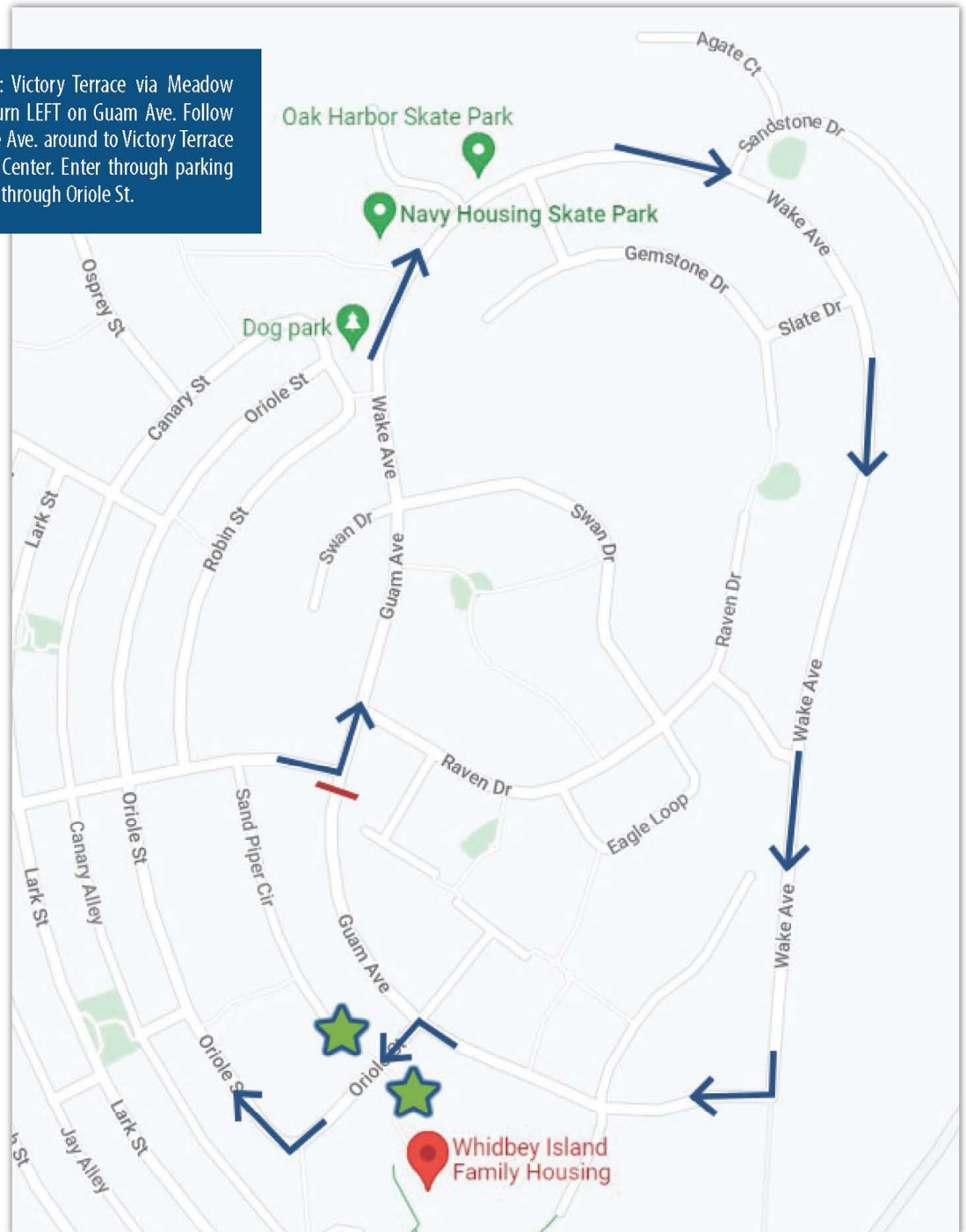
